BYE, FAITH

The common dictionary definition of faith is something like "strong belief in God or in the doctrines of a religion, based on spiritual apprehension rather than evidence." What do you think about the idea that faith is blind, or belief without evidence?

KEY TEXT: HEBREWS 11:1

Now faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see.

How is this author's definition of faith different from the common definitions of faith today?

GREAT THINGS HAVE SMALL BEGINNINGS

In Matthew 17, Jesus' disciples were frustrated because they seemed unable to replicate Jesus' miracles. They went to Jesus for advice, and he said, "You lack faith. If you have faith as small as a mustard seed, you can say to this mountain, 'Move from here to there,' and it will move. Nothing will be impossible for you" (v.20). What do you think Jesus meant by that?

Have you ever witnessed how just a little bit of faith can accomplish something great?

KEY TEXT: HEBREWS 11:8-12

By faith Abraham, when called to go to a place he would later receive as his inheritance, obeyed and went, even though he did not know where he was going. By faith he made his home in the promised land like a stranger in a foreign country; he lived in tents, as did Isaac and Jacob, who were heirs with him of the same promise. For he was looking forward to the city with foundations, whose architect and builder is God. And by faith even Sarah, who was past childbearing age, was enabled to bear children because she considered him faithful who had made the promise. And so from this one man, and he as good as dead, came descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky and as countless as the sand on the seashore.

How did Abraham's faith reflect the "mustard seed effect" of faith?

KEY TEXT: HEBREWS 11:39-40
