We have THE most thoughtful, creative kids at The Story, and all month long in July, we tackled some of their toughest questions about God and Bible. Well, we've also got some pretty thoughtful adults, and grown-ups have God-sized questions, too. So each Sunday in August, we're taking a closer look at some of the most important questions adults are asking about God and the Bible. Today's question: *Did Science Kill God?*

**THE CRUX** (A SUMMARY OF THE BIG IDEA):

While there may be some areas of obvious disagreement between modern science and Christian theology, most of these are the result of misguided practitioners (on both sides of the argument). The core principles of Christian theology and the scientific method are not only compatible - they are complementary.

**ON THE CONTRARY** (A SUMMARY OF OPPOSING PERSPECTIVES):

Christian faith and science are wholly incompatible because, while science deals with evidence and reason, faith is belief *in the absence of evidence* and *in spite of reason*. While science is inclusive, forward-thinking, and solutions-based, belief in an imaginary friend in the sky who sends unbelievers to hell is holding humanity back from true progress.

**Read: John 18:37-38** - Pontius Pilate asked him, "So you are a king?" Jesus answered, "You say that I am a king. For this I was born, and for this I came into the world, to testify to the Truth. Everyone who belongs to the Truth listens to my voice." Pilate asked him, "What is truth?"


