

## Intro to 'Earth to God'

What were your thoughts about this question before hearing this message? On what authority or knowledge do you base your understanding?


Scientists have conducted dozens of tests in an attempt to measure the effectiveness of prayer. What have those studies shown? What is the fundamental problem with these studies?
