HEBREWS RECAP

KEY TEXT: HEBREWS 12:1-3

Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes of Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. For the joy set before him he endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. Consider him who endured such opposition from sinners, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart.

ROADBLOCKS AND BOOBYTRAPS

The author says we should "throw off everything that hinders." What hindrances do you have in your life right now that might be holding you back from a deeper commitment to Christ? This could be anything from relationship drama to insecurities to spending too much time and money on entertainment.

Next, he writes, "throw off...the sin that so easily entangles." This is a tough one. How are you entangled by sin? Do you think it's possible to simply "throw off" patterns of sinful behavior?
