Week 2: How do you love Jesus with all your mind?

Day1:Transformation Romans 12:2 Do not conform to the patterns of this world, but he transformed by the renewing of your mind.

Day2:Intention <u>Philippians 4:8</u> Finally brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable - if anything is excellent or praiseworthy - think about such things.

Day3:Action <u>2 Corinthians 10:3-5</u> For though we live in the world, we do not wage war as the world does. The weapons we fight with are not the weapons of the world. On the contrary, they have divine power to demolish strongholds. We demolish arguments and every pretension that sets itself up against the knowledge of God, and we take captive every thought to make it obedient to Christ.

Day4:Aspiration <u>Colossians 3:1-2</u> If then you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth.

Day5:Patience <u>Proverbs 3:5</u> Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding.

Day6:Humility before God <u>Psalm 139</u> O Lord, you have searched me and known me! You know when I sit down and when I rise up; you discern my thoughts from afar. You search out my path and my lying down and are acquainted with all my ways. Even before a word is on my tongue, behold, O Lord, you know it altogether.

Day7:Wisdom Proverbs 3:13-18 Blessed are those who find wisdom, those who gain understanding, for she is more profitable than silver and yields better returns than gold. She is more precious than rubies; nothing you desire can compare with her. Long life is in her right hand; in her left hand are riches and honor. Her ways are pleasant ways, and all her paths are peace. She is a tree of life to those who take hold of her; those who hold her fast will be blessed.

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
