3 Ways a Mother's Love Reflects the Love of God

1. A Mother's _____

John 16:21 - A woman giving birth to a child has pain because her time has come; but when her baby is born she forgets the anguish because of her joy that a child is born into the world.

What does this passage say about the heart of a good mother? How does this reflect the heart of God?

2. A Mother's _____

<u>**Prov. 31:25-31</u>** - She is clothed with strength and dignity; she can laugh at the days to come. She speaks with wisdom, and faithful instruction is on her tongue. She watches over the affairs of her household and does not eat the bread of idleness. Her children arise and call her blessed; her husband also, and he praises her: "Many women do noble things, but you surpass them all." Charm is deceptive, and beauty is fleeting; but a woman who fears the Lord is to be praised. Honor her for all that her hands have done, and let her works bring her praise at the city gate.</u>

What does this passage say about a good mother's priorities? How does this reflect God's priorities?



<u>Matthew 23:27-30</u> - "Jerusalem, Jerusalem, you who kill the prophets and stone those sent to you, how often I have longed to gather your children together, as a hen gathers her chicks under her wings, and you were not willing. Look, your house is left to you desolate. For I tell you, you will not see me again until you say, 'Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.'"

<u>Isaiah 49:15</u> - Can a mother forget the baby at her breast and have no compassion on the child she has borne? Though she may forget I will not forget you!

What do these passages suggest about a good mother's concern? How does this reflect the concerns of God?

Jesus is our perfect role model in every respect. How did he show respect and concern for his mother during his life on earth? (see John 19:26-27)

What are some ways that Christians today can support, honor, and respect not only our own mothers but all the moms in our midst?
