<u>Simulation Theory</u>: the hypothesis that what we perceive as reality, including our universe, is an artificial simulation created by a more advanced being or civilization

What does Simulation Theory have in common with the worldview put forth by the author of Hebrews?

According to Hebrews, what kinds of things do people hold dear that are just copies of something greater?

How are attachments like alcoholism, drug addiction, and sex addiction just copies of good, heavenly things?

Ephesians 5:18 - Do not get drunk on wine, which leads to debauchery. Instead, be filled with the Spirit.

Hebrews 9:22-26 - ... the Law requires that nearly everything be cleansed with blood, and without the shedding of blood there is no forgiveness. It was necessary, then, for the copies of the heavenly things to be purified with these sacrifices, but the heavenly things themselves with better sacrifices than these. For Christ did not enter a sanctuary made with human hands that was only a copy of the true one; he entered heaven itself, now to appear for us in God's presence. Nor did he enter heaven to offer himself again and again, the way the high priest enters the Most Holy Place every year with blood that is not his own. Otherwise Christ would have had to suffer many times since the creation of the world. But he has appeared once for all at the culmination of the ages to do away with sin by the sacrifice of himself.

What does it mean that "without the shedding of blood there is no forgiveness"? Why is blood necessary:

What does the Greek word EPHÁPAX mean? How many times does it appear in Hebrews?

What does it mean to you that Jesus' sacrifice was ephápax - once for all?

Hebrews 10:1-5, 9-10, 14 - The law is only a shadow of the good things that are coming - not the realities themselves. For this reason it can never, by the same sacrifices repeated endlessly year after year, make perfect those who draw near to worship. Otherwise, would they not have stopped being offered? For the worshipers would have been cleansed once for all, and would no longer have felt guilty for their sins. But those sacrifices are an annual reminder of sins. It is impossible for the blood of bulls and goats to take away sins. Therefore, when Christ came into the world, he said... "Here I am, I have come to do your will..." and by that will, we have been made holy through the sacrifice of the body of Jesus Christ once for all... For by one sacrifice he has made perfect forever those who are being made holy.

If Jesus' sacrifice means forgiveness of sins all at once (ephápax), how is it possible for some to be condemned?

<u>Hebrews 10:15-18</u> - The Holy Spirit also testifies to us about this. First he says: "This is the covenant I will make with them after that time, says the Lord. I will put my laws in their hearts, and I will write them on their minds." Then he adds: "Their sins and lawless acts I will remember no more." And where these have been forgiven, sacrifice for sin is no longer necessary.
