MODERN NON-CHRISTIAN BELIEFS ABOUT JESUS

- MODERN JUDAISM (16 Million) Jesus was a first-century rabbi with many followers, a miracle-worker.
- **ISLAM** (2.1 Billion) He was born of a virgin, an inspired teacher and revered prophet, ascended into Heaven.
- NEW AGE/NON-RELIGIOUS/AGNOSTIC/ATHEIST (2 Billion+) He was a wise and good moral teacher
- HINDUISM (1.2 Billion) Jesus was a holy man, a guru who experienced "oneness with God," a "saint."
- BUDDHISM (500 Million) Jesus was an enlightened being, a holy person, and a wise teacher.
- MORMONISM / LATER DAY SAINTS (17.5 Million) Jesus is a son of God, created by God, who died on a cross and was resurrected to save many.
- **JEHOVAH'S WITNESSES** (9 Million) Jesus is a god and the son of God whose life "began" in Heaven as the archangel Michael, and he was resurrected (spiritually).

What do these non-Christian opinions of Jesus suggest about his true identity?

<u>John 1:12-13</u> - Yet to all who did receive him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God - children born not of natural descent, nor of human decision or a husband's will, but born of God.

- **CHRISTIANITY** (2.3 Billion) - Jesus is the one true God who, through his death and resurrection, canceled the power of sin and death once and for all, making salvation possible for everyone who has faith in him.
